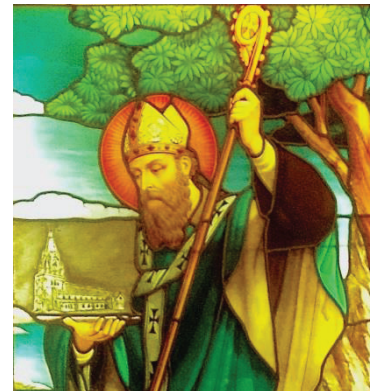

First reading: Isaiah 6.1-2a, 3-8 CCC 1137; 2809

Here I am; send me!

Second reading: 1 Corinthians 15.3-8, 11 CCC 186; 639, 652; 642; 857

I preach what the other Apostles preach, and on our preaching is your faith founded.

Gospel: Luke 5.1-11 CCC 208

Peter, James and John left everything, and followed Jesus.

In the *first reading*, the Prophet marks the harm done by even slight sins. He sees himself as “a man of unclean lips” and fears for his life, because he has seen “the King, the Lord of hosts”. His guilt humbly confessed, the Prophet’s lips are burned clean with a live coal. In this way, his “sin is blotted out”. Humility before God and frank admission of sin is a prerequisite to draw near to God. In *the Gospel*, St. Luke shows the humility of Simon Peter. With deference to Jesus, a carpenter, Peter, the professional fisherman, does as he is told, calling Christ “Master”. When he sees what Jesus does, Peter admits his sinfulness, and calls Christ, not Master, but “Lord”. In the *second reading*, St. Paul teaches that our sins were wiped out, not by the burning coal of a vision, but by the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ Jesus. In all this, Paul teaches, it is God’s grace that destroys sin and offers us happiness with God himself.

Before Mass: Master, we have worked hard all night long and have caught nothing; but if you say so, I will let down the nets. (*Lauds*)

After Mass: “Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man,” said Peter to Jesus, who replied, “Do not be afraid; from now on it is men you will catch.” (*Vespers*)

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,
